# **WELCOME TO PRIDE HOUSE GLASGOW 2016**

LEAP Sports Scotland and Unity Enterprise are excited to be bringing you Pride House for the Homeless World Cup 2016. We are delighted to invite the local and international LGBTI community and our supporters to join us in the fabulous Spoon Café and participate in the wide and exciting variety of events in our programme.

Pride Houses are pop-up venues which welcomes LGBTI athletes, fans and their allies during international sporting events. Akin to the various national houses, they are welcoming places to view the competitions, to enjoy the event, to learn about LGBTI sport and homophobia and transphobia in sport, as well as to build relations with mainstream sport.

At our central location in Merchant City, Pride House will offer a programme of inclusive sport, cultural and social events. Full details of all the events including speakers, can be found on our website at

We work as part of Pride House International an international coalition of LGBTI sport and human rights groups promoting the cause of equality in and by sport. The group have been responsible for houses starting at the 2010 Winter Olympic and Paralympic Games in Vancouver/Whistler, and covering the Olympics, Pan-American Games, UEFA European Championships in 2012 and 2016 and many more. After being refused permission to host a Pride House at Sochi, Russia in 2014, the international community hosted a Remote Pride House programme around the world, in solidarity. Other houses are planned for Rio 2016, Pyeongchang 2018, Gold Coast 2018 and Tokyo 2020. See more at www.pridehouseinternational.org

Of course Glasgow has already hosted a Pride House back in 2014 for the Commonwealth Games. Seeing 6,000 visitors during its time open, Pride House helped to provide a focus for the equality and human rights programming during the Commonwealth Games. It was a space where practice was shared, behaviours were challenged, friendships were formed, and sport was celebrated. We hope that our work on Pride House this time around has created a warm and welcoming space which has something for everyone. Come and be our guest.






